Plagiarism Checklist

When is a source citation needed within the body of the text?

- 1. There is a quote taken exactly from the source that is enclosed in quotation marks. (Note that a quote that is not included in quotation marks is automatically plagiarism, even if the citation is included)
- 2. Phrases, sentences or paragraphs have been taken from a source, and words have been deleted, rearranged or changed to synonyms to alter the text but not the meaning or the idea.
- 3. The idea and the precise meaning of the text has been paraphrased without adding to or changing the idea.
- 4. The author is referred to directly in the sentence.
